The **60th AGM** was held on **Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> June.** Here are some of the main points.

#### **Attendance**

**66 members** attended and **20 apologies** were received.

#### **Financials**

The **Statement of Accounts** and **Balance Sheet** for the Financial year ended 30<sup>th</sup> of April 2023 and the **Budget for 2023-2024** were accepted. **Alistair Salt** (Treasurer) commented that the club had a **great year** with post Covid celebrations and successful grant applications contributing along with solar power reducing our energy bills. Corporate bar sales and green hire were strong contributors.

**Bowls NZ** and **Bowls Canterbury levies** are to **increase** this coming season and this along with recommendations made by Bowls NZ led to a decision being made to increase our club Subscription fees. The meeting voted that all fees be **increased by \$5.00**:

#### **Notices of Motion:**

## **Spotlight on Hamish Wilson**

For the next couple of weeks we'll have a closer look at some of the **returning executive** members. Here are links to **previous bios** of the **current executive**: President <u>Richard Bruce</u>, Secretary <u>Jill Lee</u> and long term member <u>Kerrie Bruce</u>.

Hamish holds many important roles in the club. He is currently our **Vice President**, **Chair** of the **Men's Match Committee** and joint **Bar Manager**. Phew! He is also the current Men's **Singles Champion**. Here is a bit more about him.

Hamish grew up on a **dairy farm** in the **Rai Valley** halfway between Nelson and Blenheim. His parents are both farmers and his sister is a vet. Growing up on a farm, his first job was helping with the **milking**. Hamish started **playing bowls** at **age 11**, joining his father at **Havelock** Bowling Club. He used second hand shoes and bowls organised by "the giant" (**Andre Smith** – a champion Marlborough bowler). It was there he **learnt** how to **pour a pint** of beer. He was often seen behind the bar until a **retired policeman**, a member of the club, complained that he shouldn't be **serving beer at age 11**.



Hamish attended school at **Nelson College** as a boarder and joined **United Bowling Club**. He spent much of his spare time down at the bowling club and has a number of club titles there. Hamish also holds several **Nelson Centre titles** and **represented Nelson** on several occasions, playing the singles for the centre prior to the arrival of Shannon Mcilroy. Hamish also served on the **Executive** of United Bowling Club.

At the **age of 17**, Hamish moved to **Motueka** to commence **flight training** to become a Pilot. In **2008** he gained his **commercial pilot's license** at the age of 18 and at the age of 19, became a **flying instructor** for the flight school he trained at. During this time, Hamish also worked as a ski **instructor** at Rainbow ski field and as a **barman** at the **Riwaka Hotel**. At one point, he was managing **3 different jobs** at one time and somehow getting **paid for 8 days** of work **a week**.

In 2012 Hamish headed overseas where he spent 4 months traveling around USA, Canada, UK and Europe before moving to a small town in Australia called Jabari in the Northern Territory. There he spent 5 months in the Australian outback flying aboriginal locals and tourists around. In 2014 Hamish moved to Christchurch to start working for Air NZ, flying regional routes as a First Officer and in 2016, he became a Captain. Hamish is an elected delegate of the New Zealand Airline Pilots Association and represents around 550 colleagues in that role.

Hamish is an **excellent bowler**. He has **6 club championship** titles and has **represented Canterbury** several times. One of the highlights of his career was winning the **Kittyhawk singles** in Auckland when he was 18 years old. The Kittyhawk was a singles **youth tournament** and was unofficially regarded as the New Zealand U19 tournament and title. It was similar to the current Burnside U26 singles. The **trophy** from the tournament was **so large** that it **didn't fit** in the overhead **locker** of an Air NZ plane, a fact Hamish only realised after boarding the plane.

Somewhat accident prone, he had a **ski accident** but ignored the discomfort, carried on **skiing**, and the next day **flew a plane**. That afternoon after some convincing from a nurse friend he went and got it looked at. Long story short, it turned out he had **fractured his tibia bone** in his left leg. An interesting discovery during the Xray and MRI Scans was that he had previously **fractured his leg** at a similar location **years earlier** but had been **completely unaware**. Another incident occurred a couple of years ago when he was walking the **Milford track**, head down in the pouring rain he **walked head first into a tree** which was obscured by his cap. He only realised after he was flat on his back staring up at it. Last year Hamish had **back surgery** to fix a **herniated disk** in his back, another injury that he isn't fully sure about how or when it occurred. Let's hope he keeps out of trouble this year.

Outside of bowls Hamish enjoys skiing at the Canterbury club ski fields, modern jive dancing where he competes at dance competitions around New Zealand (he has a couple of medals to show for his efforts). He also enjoys hiking and checking out the many backcountry huts scattered around New Zealand. As a hobby, Hamish fixes up damaged flat pack furniture when he has time. He is currently in the process of designing and then building some townhouses to replace an old house he owns that was damaged by the earthquakes .
