Meg will update the Bowls Canterbury information line as new information comes to hand. We aim to have all green closures updated on the info line by **8:00am**.

There will also be a post on the **Bowls Canterbury Facebook Page** which will be updated as new information comes in. . If neither the greenkeeper or green superintendent communicate with Meg, the green is assumed to be open. We encourage players to check directly with the club concerned if they are in doubt, to avoid any unnecessary travel.

Umpire's Corner

Question (LXXXIV)

A bowl at rest on rink 1 is in danger of being moved by a bowl which has just been delivered on rink 2. If games on both rinks are team games, what action can be taken to prevent a collision?

What if the game on rink 1 is a singles game?

Answer

Part 1 – any player at the head can either: -

- Lift the bowl on rink 1 to allow the bowl from rink 2 to pass and then replace it, providing that lifting the bowl would not influence the outcome of the head.
- Stop the bowl from rink 2 (which can be replayed) (Law 37.6.1)

Part 2 – the marker MUST stop the bowl from rink 2 (which can be replayed) (Law 37.6.2)

Question (LXXXV)

A bowl, which is a non-toucher, is knocked into the ditch and moves a toucher which is in the ditch. What should happen?

What if the bowl knocked in IS a toucher?

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
