## Umpires Corner (the final answer)

#### Question (C)

Describe the correct position for players when at the head end of the rink.

#### **Answer:**

If they are members of the team in control of the head, behind the jack. If they are members of the team not in control of the head, behind the jack and away from the head, on the surrounds of the green if the jack is in the ditch, or well clear of the head if unable to stand on the surrounds. (Law 12.1.2)

Reminder – Players at the mat end of the rink who are not delivering a bowl should stand at least 1 metre behind the mat. (Law 12.1.1)

Reminder – possession of the rink changes as soon as a bowl comes to rest, or after allowing time for marking if a toucher. (Law 13.2)



#### **Bowls Tactics**

#### **Trial ends**

The placement of the jack is a distraction on trial ends, especially when playing away from home. Bowl to a 3 metre jack as if you were at Burnside , if it's short or long you can make that adjustment. Watch the bowls your teammates and the opposition play. Pay attention to bowls delivered too wide or narrow; how did they react? Skips and thirds are often drawing to a jack that has moved off the centre line. Drawing to the ditch or to the edge of the rink provides valuable information.
