Spotlight on Graham Lowery

This week we find out a bit more about another new life member, **Graham Lowery**.

Graham comes from the **West Coast**. He was born in Greymouth and spent his early childhood in **Blackball** before moving to **Belfast**. (His father died on the Belfast Bowling Green when Graham was about 20.)

Following his secondary schooling at **Papanui High**, Graham started work as a **draughting** cadet at the **MED/Orion Power** authority. He qualified as an **electrician** and then an electrical **equipment designer**.



Graham then spent 10 years **consulting** to the Christchurch City Council and Selwyn District Council, designing **street lighting**, **subdivisions** and **special projects**. After **40 years** he **retired in 1997**.

Graham has always been involved in sport. He played **rugby** in his youth and was a successful **athlete**. He has a very long history as an **indoor bowler** winning numerous championships and playing at **representative level**. He was made a **life member** of **Bishopdale** Indoor Bowling Club after playing for **47 years**!

In **1986** he joined **Burnside** Bowling Club. For **twenty years** he was the **maintenance convenor**. This is a **huge job** that includes (but certainly not limited to) coordinating interior and exterior **upkeep**, electrical **maintenance**, managing **safety** checks and **servicing** fire equipment. The **high standard** of the Burnside pavilion and surrounds made it possible for the club to be selected as the host for the **World Bowls** in **2008**.

Graham played a **large part** in the smooth running of the **World Bowls** championships leading to him being awarded the **Fendalton Waimairi** Community Board Community **Service award** in **2008** and the **Bowls NZ Volunteer** of the Year **2009-2010**. Not resting on his laurels, Graham kept contributing and received a **Bowls Canterbury Volunteer** of the Year Merit Award in **2012-2013**.

Astonishingly Graham found time for a number of other **community activities**. These included being the **chair of Isleworth School Board** for many years, helping with rescuing **Grant Armstrong Park** from subdivision, and winning **numerous council garden awards** in Avonhead.

He has been married to **June** for **55 years** and they moved to **Alpine View** Lifestyle Village in **2019**. They have two children, 5 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren all in Christchurch. I guess they will keep busy!

Graham wants to **thank June** for her **support and patience**. I'm sure all the members of Burnside do too!

Bowls Tactics

What your skip doesn't want

- **Leads:** Do not play a game of singles against your opposition! Don't just play to the jack as your bowl may end up out of position and not have a meaningful role in the end.
- **Short Bowls**: A bowl shorter than a metre is worse than no good. It just makes the skips job harder to reach the main part of the end. Good skips might give you a wee clap and say good effort, but they are muttering under their breath.
- Watch Your Bowls: Always watch your bowl until it comes to rest, no matter how poor it is. You will learn something if only sub consciously. As one skip quipped "if I have to watch this crap so do you."
