# **Spotlight on Judy Davidson**

Judy has always been a Christchurch girl. After attending Redcliffs Primary and Avonside Girls High she went to Teachers College in 1956. Following that she spent a year in Dunedin specialising in Physical Education. For the next few years she was a Phys Ed consultant, visiting primary schools as far away as Kaikoura, before moving into classroom teaching. She really enjoyed primary school teaching (mostly at Merrin St and West Spreydon) and carried on until her retirement in 1996. A long long career!



However teaching wasn't her only career. Judy is an **eclectic sportswoman**. She has been a **Canterbury representative** in golf, hockey and badminton but it was **tennis** where she made her name.

Her **parents** were both very sporty. Her **mother** represented Canterbury in **hockey** and her **father** was a Canterbury and South Island **rugby league** representative. Judy started tennis with a table tennis bat, hitting a ball against the wall of the house. But she must have acquired a real racquet at some stage because she **won** her **first tournament** at age 10 and was the **NZ Secondary Schools Champion** three times.

She became **NZ Junior singles** and **mixed doubles champion** in **1955** and represented NZ in 1956 on a trip to **Australia**. After that she won another **four open NZ titles**, Women's Singles in 1962, Women's Doubles and Mixed Doubles (twice).

The **highlight** of her tennis career was a **5 month trip** to **Europe** and **Asia** in **1962**. Women didn't often get the opportunity to travel on these trips, but in this case the manager of the Men's Davis Cup team was taking his wife. As she could be a chaperone, a **team of four women** were able to travel too and Judy was selected. Judy played at **Wimbledon** reaching the **third round** before being beaten by the **defending champion**. She also played in the **French Open** finding her first outing on **clay** a real **challenge**. Exciting times!

One of the **conditions** of travel was that the athletes had to play tennis in **NZ for two years** after the trip. After that Judy **retired** from tennis and took up **golf**, **representing Canterbury** several times between 1969 and 1984. She later returned to tennis as a veteran player for a few years.

Following her **retirement** from **teaching** in **1996**, Judy joined **United Bowling Club**, playing there until it closed at which time she moved to **Burnside** in **2009**. At Burnside she has been a **selector**, on the **match committee** and **club captain** for a number of years. She has also **organised** the hugely enjoyable Burnside **Women's Triples Tournament** several times. She is an excellent bowler and this year won her **Silver Star!** 

Judy recently moved to **Summerset Avonhead**, where she is enjoying making **new friends**. She is combining her **teaching** and **sporting** interests by **teaching bowls** to a number of the residents. She has also taken up line **dancing** and is in a **skiffle group**.



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### **Bowls Tactics**

#### Playing the same hand

- The **lead** and **second** should stay on the **same hand** throughout the course of the game as chopping and changing does not help anyone.
- Unless you have a **perfect identical action** on both hands you will find it **difficult** working out the **correct weight** when you **swap**.
- Inconsistent weed covering, wind direction and general wear
  will mean that very rarely will both sides of the rink have identical
  speed and shape of turn.



• If you have a **wide** hand and a **narrow** hand the bowl will have to travel an **extra 2m** on the wide hand to **reach the jack**. I was taught to add a **yard** when changing hands (metres hadn't been invented back then!).
