Spotlight on Bill Fowlie

Bill has had a remarkable **career** organising and managing **major International Bowls events.** He provided support for the **World Bowls** CoC Singles (2006), was **Assistant to the General Manager** for the Asia Pacific Championships (2007) and World Bowls (2008). He was **Event Manager** for World Bowls CoC Singles (2013 and 2014), Asia Pacific Championships (2015), World Bowls (2016), Tests and Trans Tasman Championship (2014-16) and **Technical Delegate** for Bowls at the Pacific Games in Samoa. Whew!!!!

When the **Commonwealth Games** were scheduled in **New Delhi** in **2010** there were **no greens** and **no experienced** personnel. Bill tells me he was thrust into the job of **Competition Manager for Bowls** in June **2009** and with a "lot of toil and loud shouting" over **18 months** got there in the end. He has recently **self-published** a light hearted look at this period. Two copies of "**A wrong Bias- An Indian Tale 2009-10**" are in the bookshelf by the Dining room entrance for club members to read.

Here is more of **Bill's story** in his **own words**.

I was born in **Auckland** in **1947**. I then lived in **Mangakino** for 4 years after which the mill town **Tokoroa** became my home until the end of my teens. I played **cricket** and **rugby** with no aplomb. The latter I retired at age 20 after I was run over by a **Jonah Lomu lookalike** – 15 stone against my dripping wet 8 stone was a mismatch of great proportions. I know how the English fullback (Mike Catt) felt when the real Lomu ran over him to score in the World Cup of 1995.

I entered **married** life in **1971** and have **2 children** (Robert and Chris) from that relationship. In **1974** my family and I transferred to **Wanganui** where 3 things of significance happened – My marriage failed (1975), I found bowls (1978) and more importantly **Linley** came into my life (1978).



Linley and I **married** on 27th December **1980**, two days before playing in the Nationals in Auckland. This was the start of Linley's life as a **Bowling widow**. Son Daniel was born in 1982 and daughter Natasha followed in 1986. They have given us **4 grandchildren**, Jade, Will, Grace and Eve.

Work life commenced in 1964 with a brief stint as a Menswear salesman. My yearning for a banking career saw me join the BNZ in 1965 which in turn had me transferring to the new era of computers in the banking industry – Databank. This change took me to Hamilton, Auckland, Palmerston North and finally Wellington where I finished in 1974. I then joined Wanganui Savings Bank as their Systems Manager, a connection with the Trustbank movement that lasted for 25 years and stints in Wanganui, Hamilton and finally moving to Christchurch in 1991.

In **1999** with **Trustbank** taken over by **Westpac** I took **redundancy** to reconsider the next direction of my career. I was offered **contract work** with a NZ Post subsidiary **Datamail** which had me managing the scanning of **15 million pages** from the **2001 Census**, setting up a **computer centre** in Fiji for **Post Fiji**, the creation of a **Print and Mail** centre for a Kuwaiti company, a task that saw me **residing in Kuwait** for 9 months. Other contracts over the next few years involved consolidating **NZ Post back-office** operations in the main centres. This work was interspersed with my involvement in major bowls events.

Spotlight on Bill Fowlie (Cont)

My **bowling career** started at the **Wanganui RSA** Bowling club in **1978** where I was lucky to have a great **coach** in the late **Laurie Penn** with whom I won my first club title – Fours. Wanganui had a very competitive bowling scene in those day when you would regularly come up against **greats** like Peter **Bellis**, Keith **Slight** and the late Brian **Trillo** (all NZ reps). My first entry in the Centre **Open Singles** had me **drawn against Bellis** who in 20 minutes had me **trounced 21-1**. Instead of heading off tail between my legs Peter took me aside and said we were going to have a **few more ends** and we would only stop once a couple other games had completed. A story Peter and I have shared over a few drinks in the intervening years. **A true sportsman**.

My remaining club titles were won at the **Hamilton Bowling Club** (Pairs) and finally at the **Hillcrest Bowling Club** (Triples). In my **31 years at Burnside**, I have yet to get my name on the Honours Board for Titles won but feature on the Executive Honours boards as **Secretary** (2004-2005) and **President** (2012-2014), the highlight being **President for the club's 50-year celebrations**. I have been the club Centre **Results Coordinator** for the past 8 years as well as being the **editor** for **210 editions** of the **Hotline** before passing the baton on both these tasks earlier this year.



Bowls Tactics

Roles of the team members (cont)

Third

The third needs a **full range of shots** and must be in sync with the skip. In successful teams you will find the skip and the 3rd (2nd in triples) will **trust each other's calls** without question. They will back up the skip if the other players are having a grumble.



Skip


As a skip you need to give the players **clear concise directions**. Standing on the head with both arms outstretched telling them to **do what they want** is no instruction and doesn't help your player. You should have already **noticed** if they have a **preference** or are bowling closer on one hand. **Play to their strength** they'll love you for it.

Body language and **demeanour** are extremely **important**. Sitting down, or folding arms may be comfortable but it does not instil confidence. It's also great to **talk to the opposition** skip but **not** while your team member is **bowling**.

The skip needs the **full range** of shots and should **build a plan** to get the best outcomes and thwart the opposition. It has been said that the skip's job is to save 7 shots and gain 7 shots over the course of a game, but there's no doubt that **capitalising on bonus shot** opportunities can be the **winning of the game**. Too often a skip is **relieved** or content they have the shot and are **too tentative** in their attempt to **gain another**.
